The delegates had a heated discussion regarding this issue, with several stating that this was by no means an act of war. Moreover, as Article 39 of the UN Charter did not specify what was and was not defined as war, the committee took it upon themselves to amend the UN Charter and add a substantial definition of the same.

Tensions were eased as the following clauses were added after the General Assembly voted in majority for the amendment:

1)Deployment of any nuclear missiles or weapons in any country. 2)Deployment of troops in any foreign countries

except for aid in conditions where peace is threatened.
Only further developments can suggest whether this conflict would turn into something bigger and dangerous.





The delegate of Norway quoted to all other delegates that, people should be aware about the scams of crypto currency..... You said Buy Crypto No, I said Bye Crypto






The delegate of Canada stated that a few other regulations can put in order for crypto freedom and regulation to co-exist could be as follower.
